Rebecca Vassie Memorial Award 2022

The Rebecca Vassie Trust is a charitable organisation supporting the art of long-form narrative photography, and promoting education in and through photography for emerging professionals, young people and the broader public. The Trust was set up following the tragic death of the British photographer and photojournalist Rebecca Vassie, aged 30, while on assignment in Uganda in 2015.

The Trust is inspired by the drive Rebecca had to capture under-represented human stories and her struggle to get the work she saw as important into the public arena. Rebecca was also an advocate for equality and diversity in the arts.

Through the annual Rebecca Vassie Memorial Award a new photo essay is funded every year. Projects have explored an Islamic minority in Israel, social deprivation in Glasgow, the role of therapy in post-genocide Rwanda, a fresh light on Britain's oldest generation, and refugees finding home in Northern England.

This year Jamie Sinclair has been awarded the fifth Rebecca Vassie Memorial Award for his proposal 'Hjem (home)'. The £2,000 bursary is supporting Sinclair as he returns to his hometown of Ashington, Northumberland, where a significant number of refugees are being housed. In his proposal, Sinclair said he wanted to "intimately narrate the experience of asylum seekers and refugees being settled into northern working class towns, working with both residents and refugees".

Fancy a history lesson? Read on.....

Every year, on 19 August, we (apparently!) observe World Photography Day – a globally recognized celebration of the photograph and its history. What actually is World Photography Day, though, and why is does it take place on this particular date?

This is the date that recognizes the invention of the Daguerrotype, a process that was devised by the French artist and photographer, Louis-Jacques-Mandé Daguerre in 1837. His idea was then effectively sold to the French Academy of Sciences, which subsequently gifted the process to the world on 19 August 1839.
