Definitions - Street

Jill has been in touch just to clarify the definition of Urban/Street photography which she mentioned on Monday night. This updates the definitions section below:

Urban / Street Photography

Urban photography is a broad genre that can include anything within a built-up, urban environment, so the image must convey an aspect of a city or town. Your image must have been taken in a built-up urban environment but does not have to include people, so things like street signs, traffic, architecture, shop facades, light trails, crowds, bridges, are all part of urban life. Your image can be a candid shot of people i.e. Street Photography which is also accepted.

Lightroom - recent updates

We have a Lightroom night coming up (more volunteers required - see below!). However, in view of the major changes to Lightroom's 'develop' module over the last year, I thought it would be helpful for all you Lightroom users out there to give you a link to one of Adobe's ambassadors, Julieanne Kost. Following yet another significant update in October 2022, she has posted a 30 min summary on YouTube covering all the features in the Masking tool, previously known as the Graduated, Radial and Adjustment tools. There's also an Anthony Morganti YouTube feature covering just the recent Oct changes. As you'll see, everything is getting very 'AI'.

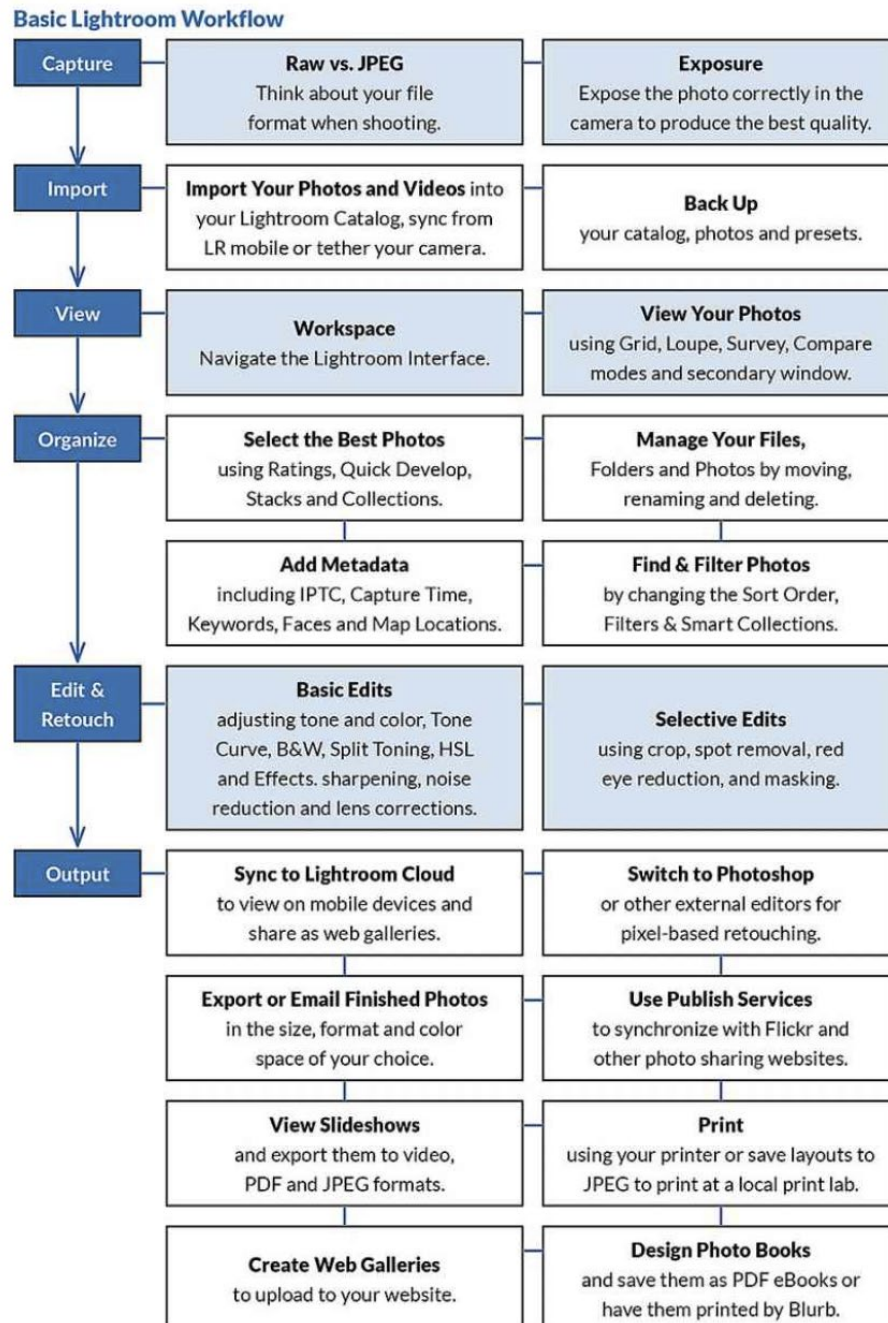
Lightroom - Monday 21st November - volunteers needed

Whilst we've all benefited from Shaun's excellent practical Photoshop nights on both Zoom and F2F over few years, we felt that Lightroom should be given an airing. More so now given significant recent upgrades to Lightroom which have closed the gap to some of Photoshop processing tools. Of course both Lightroom and Photoshop use the imbedded 'Camera Raw' software for basic alterations so there is some overlap.

Whilst there's definitely those who want to learn Lightroom, some members use Affinity or Photoshop Elements and then there's the expanding DXO and Topaz software gathering ground as

worthy processing competitors. We might run an evening demonstrating what these software options can offer both as holistic processing options and as ‘plug-ins’.

Because of the complexity of Lightroom, we can’t cover every aspect in an evening so we are going to focus on how it works to attract potential new users who might be put off at the moment and help existing users get more out of the software. By way of background Mike has produced a very helpful Lightroom workflow structure:



Against this background, the important sections to consider are Import, View, Organise and Edit. At the moment David Wallis is going to deal with the Import/View sections and John Smith will cover Organise – albeit with some overlap (which John and David are liaising on).

The Edit ('Develop') section is an important area, particularly with the recent upgrade and reorganisation to the masking & selection tools. We felt that this could split this into at least two potential presentations, a) basic edits using the develop module, and b) selections & masks.

So, if any member, conversant with all the recent Lightroom Classic upgrades, would like to volunteer to make a short presentation on any aspect of the 'develop' module, please let us know. We can sort the running order out either in advance or on the night. We have the latest Lightroom Classic version loaded onto the club's PC. Mike has offered to dovetail a presentation into the evening and I'm happy just to give a quick rundown of my workflow approach in using the 'develop' module.

Club Programme Change - May 8th 2023

With Monday 8th May 2023 now an additional Bank Holiday to commemorate the Coronation, we've cancelled our club night on that date. The Annual competition judging has therefore been brought forward to 24th April and the Panel Challenge/Then and Now moved to the 17th April.

Club Competitions – Set Subject A-E Definitions

A: ABSTRACT

Abstract photography is the art of capturing subjects in such a way that does not attempt to represent external reality, but seeks to achieve its effect using shapes, forms, colours, and textures. It can encompass a huge variety of subject matter, take us out of our comfort zone, make us question what we see, or invite us to enter another realm. The subject matter is often implied or suggested rather than overtly and literally presented. Any image that is altered reality is acceptable.

B: REFLECTIONS

“Reflection photos refer to any shot, no matter what type of photography genre, that uses a reflective surface.” This can be a landscape, building, water, windows etc.

C: URBAN or STREET PHOTOGRAPHY

Urban photography is a broad genre that can include anything within a built-up, urban environment, so the image must convey an aspect of a city or town. Your image must have been taken in a built-up urban environment but does not have to include people, so things like street signs, traffic, architecture, shop facades, light trails, crowds, bridges, are all part of urban life. Your image can be a candid shot of people i.e. Street Photography which is also accepted.

D: FOG / STEAM / MIST / SMOKE

This topic can include a wide variety of images, from misty morning landscapes to smoke wisps created at home – as long as the predominant effect / subject includes Steam or Mist or Smoke or Fog.

E: MULTIPLE EXPOSURES

Multiple exposure means superimposing two or more photos to create a completely new, different image either directly in the camera or afterwards in image processing.
