Meet the new member - Fin Simpson

This week is the turn of Fin Simpson, who's very kindly put together an interesting bit about himself. Here's Fin:

Hi Martyn. Happy to share some background on my photo journey. It all started before I reached double figures as I persuaded my dad that I could use his Kodak Box Brownie (that should get a few members googling!). I had one of the best collections of family photos with either heads or legs chopped off but this did not put me off and in early teens progressed to a Kodak Instamatic with far better results.

Once I was old enough to get a paper round it was a further "upgrade" to a Praktica 35mm SLR doing my own B&W developing and using my school's darkroom (a converted broom cupboard) to learn the dark art of dodging and burning. On leaving school my photographic adventure seems to get parked and to this day I still wonder what happened to my Praktica!

Fast Forward to my 40th Birthday and a once in a lifetime trip to Moscow and St Petersburg which needed recording so I acquired a Ricoh 35mm Compact and the photo bug took over once again.

Soon I moved up to a Canon EOS 500N with a couple of zoom lenses which have locked me in to Canon to this day but still just shooting for personal pleasure and occasional family events.

In 2003 I acquired my first digital SLR the EOS 10D with a "free" copy of Photoshop Elements 2 thrown in. I still have the 10D which I replaced with a 40D, later picking up a second hand 1200D which came with several IS lenses which were what I was really after but decided to keep the 1200D. This is the one I use mostly today. I have stuck with Elements getting up to version 14 which seems to still fit my current needs.

When I lived in Hertfordshire, the Camera Club in my village held an exhibition every year, for several years I would go along with the intention of joining but regularly chickened out due to the high quality of the images on display. However in 2017, I bit the bullet and joined Croxley Camera Club and quickly experienced the highs and lows of judges feedback! I have no real favourite genre but do enjoy trying to find a unique interpretation for set subject competitions. Sometimes it works with judges, Sometimes it doesn't!

Being a member at Croxley for several years means I do have a back catalogue of DPI's and prints to call upon so you will see a mix of both new and "recycled" competition entries for the next couple of years from me. Hope that helps and many thanks

who has one or more images representing the club in this prestigious competition. The images are set out below.





Prints & Photographs Auction | Bonhams Skinner

This would place it into the same genre as oil paintings - a unique image. Check out this auction coming up in the US. Interestingly there's an Ansel Adams picture of Half Dome, Yosemite NP with an estimate of \$1000 - \$1500 whereas the auction 'headline' image by Edward Weston the (apparently) famous 'Nude on Sand' is estimated as \$70,000 - \$100,000. Take a look at both and tell me which one would do well in a camera club comp!! Umm. What am I missing? Is Ansel's

image library quietly churning out prints of his images? Is Edward Weston's print unique? Who knows. Perhaps we should get a speaker from an auction house to give us the SP on selling photos. Might be quiet interesting for those of you who follow photographers particularly those who may not now be around. I'm rabbiting. Check out the auction - you can't take your kids inheritance with you!!

Finding Vivian Maier

Continuing the above theme (sort of), do you recall our recent Zoom speaker Ian Henderson mentioning the documentary 'Finding Vivian Maier' which he highly recommended. Well it's on Amazon Prime (see below). I haven't watched it yet. Funnily enough she came onto my radar last year.

Vivian Maier (1926 – 2009) was an American street photographer whose massive, unseen body of work came to light when it was purchased from an auction in Chicago in 2007. Born in New York City, Maier spent some of her youth in France and then worked in Chicago as a nanny and caregiver for most of her life. In her leisure, however, Maier ventured into the art of photography. Consistently taking photographs over the course of five decades, she would ultimately leave behind over 100,000 negatives.

While her photographs have compelled viewers around the world since being brought to the public eye after she died in relative poverty, there is much that remains unknown about the enigmatic woman behind the lens. A fascinating and sad story. Here's a Wikipedia link as well as the Amazon one:

Club Competitions – Set Subject A-E Definitions

A: ABSTRACT

Abstract photography is the art of capturing subjects in such a way that does not attempt to represent external reality, but seeks to achieve its effect using shapes, forms, colours, and textures. It can encompass a huge variety of subject matter, take us out of our comfort zone, make us question what we see, or invite us to enter another realm. The subject matter is often implied or suggested rather than overtly and literally presented. Any image that is altered reality is acceptable.

B: REFLECTIONS

"Reflection photos refer to any shot, no matter what type of photography genre, that uses a reflective surface." This can be a landscape, building, water, windows etc.

C: URBAN or STREET PHOTOGRAPHY

Urban photography is a broad genre that can include <u>anything</u> within a built-up, <u>urban</u> environment, so the image must convey an aspect of a city or town. Your image must have been taken in a built-up urban environment but does <u>not</u> have to include people, so things like street signs, traffic, architecture, shop facades, light trails, crowds, bridges, are all part of urban life. Your image can be a candid shot of people i.e. Street Photography which is also accepted.

D: FOG / STEAM / MIST / SMOKE

This topic can include a wide variety of images, from misty morning landscapes to smoke wisps created at home – as long as the predominant effect / subject includes Steam or Mist or Smoke or Fog.

E: MULTIPLE EXPOSURES

Multiple exposure means superimposing two or more photos to create a completely new, different image either directly in the camera or afterwards in image processing.
