AI in Photoshop

It's all arriving sooner than I thought. Here's an interesting Scott Kelby YouTube post on the latest Photoshop Beta programme (out for testing I assume). It's got a new Ai element called 'Generative Fill' which is pretty amazing and I guess will find its way onto the main Creative Cloud platform pretty soon. It is however usable now.

Whilst some of the stuff on removing unwanted elements is just speeding up an existing time-consuming healing and cloning process (and content aware), the 'adding' element is a game changer. It's quite a long video but worth watching. I remember Shaun's Photoshop talk a couple of years ago on adding a sky - in competition terms ok if it's your sky from a collection of your sky images but it's not ok if accessed from the Adobe stock library. This changes all that and you can't see the join. Scott mentions his concern over its impact on Competitions. Worth a look.

Henry Fox Talbot: Exhibition pays homage to photography pioneer

Here's something for all you history buffs and it's not too far away. The contribution played by Victorian photography pioneer Henry Fox Talbot will be showcased in a new exhibition. BBC News has taken a look at the impact of his work in creating the world's first negative and how it inspired artists for generations to come. The new exhibition is paying homage to Mr Fox Talbot by displaying the work of an internationally renowned photographic artist who has spent her career furthering his legacy. Ellen Carey's work is being shown in the apt surroundings of Lacock Abbey, Wiltshire, Mr Fox Talbot's home in the 19th Century and Britain's birthplace of photography. Definitions of Set Subjects

Glass: Clear, broken, cut, coloured, stained, reflected, distorted, etc – this subject offers a huge range of creative ideas - be as imaginative as you dare! Ensure the main element / device / impression uses glass so the theme is obvious.

A Portrait: A portrait photograph is the capture of the likeness of a living person or creature in which the face and expression is predominant. The objective is to display the likeness, personality or the mood of the subject. The focus is the person's or creature's face, although the entire body may be included. A portrait is generally *not* a snapshot, but a composed image of a person or creature.

The Colour Wheel: Extremely colourful images are accepted in this category, using all the colours on the colour wheel, or create an image which uses complementary colours on the wheel for added impact (ie red / green, orange / blue, yellow /purple). The main impact of the image must be the use of colour to maximum effect. Search for Colour Theory on the internet for more information.

High Key / Low Key photography make use of lighting and contrast (or lack thereof) to create a specific mood. Most of the tones will be towards the **left** of the histogram for a **low key** image and towards the far **right** in a **high key** image. Again the internet has lots of useful articles and examples

Long Exposure: The image must show the effect of using a slow shutter speed and long exposure time – it must show an extended period of time, and that the image has been enhanced by the use of long exposure. Panning of moving subjects is allowed but other ICM techniques are not. Blur introduced through post processing is also not allowed.
