Returning to the Mop Fair, having looked at my (Martyn) images from last year, I decided to risk putting my ISO on auto setting with an adjusted range of 50-102500 and control everything via shutter speed (TV or Time Value). It was inevitable that some images were going to be very grainy (noisy) but it also gave me the opportunity to test out a Denoise Plug-in I use in post processing. There's going to be an opportunity in November later to have a look at what some correcting Plug-ins can achieve which Dave is going to schedule into the prog. Here's a shot taken at ISO 102500 (!) before and after using DXO's 'Pure Raw 3' denoise software.

Plug ins - a note

I've been investigating buying a Plug-in editor recently and have come across something you might find interesting either whether you are someone who has a plug-in editor (e.g. Topaz, DXO Pure Raw, Silver Efex etc) or whether you are thinking about buying one. Whilst the download process is pretty standard including automatically placing your plug-in into your processing software for easy access, what is more mystifying is that it is the Plug-in software author/manufacturer which initially decides where, in your processing software, it ends up. The result is that it can be hiding in a number of places so that when you go to 'Edit-in' to use your fancy new Plug-in, it might not be there. However you will almost certainly find it in 'Plug-in extras' in the 'File' tool bar (Mac). It's just the way the authors decide to do it and it has no effect on the outcome of the editing process.

If you want to move your plug-in into the 'edit-in' toolbar so they are all in one place, here's a YouTube tutorial how to do it. It's pretty easy.

Thinking about buying Topaz AI photo?

The reviews about the latest (September) version of this 'one stop shop' software have been pretty good but if you are already using heavyweight processing software like Lightroom, Photoshop, Affinity, Elements etc and you are just looking for a plug-in then Topaz AI Photo might be a bit over the top particularly at \$199. Photo AI incorporates features which Topaz also offer as stand alone purchasable Plug-in options namely Sharpen AI, Denoise AI and the upscaling Gigapixel AI. However these features within Topaz Photo AI are not as comprehensive as the stand alone options. So, if you are looking for just, say, a sharpen or denoise plug-in, go for one of Topaz's cheaper and more comprehensive stand alone Plug-in options at \$99. You get free updates for one year and when a new version comes out you often get a discounted upgrade offer if you feel the upgrade is worth it.

Wildlife Photographer of the Year winner announced

Well, the big one has come around again and the winner of the WPOY competition has just been announced. Both amazing and sometimes harrowing in equal measure the competition showcases the best of wilding photography from across the globe. This year is no exception. A picture of a mysterious and other-worldly horseshoe crab has earned Laurent Ballesta the title of Wildlife Photographer of the Year (WPY) 2023. The golden marine arthropod is seen hugging the bottom muds in waters off Pangatalan Island, in the Philippines.

It is tracked by three small fish, hoping the crab's movements will expose an opportunistic meal in the sediment. Ballesta becomes only the second photographer in WPY's 59-year history to win the competition twice.

In 2021, he was awarded the grand prize for capturing a trio of groupers in the act of spawning.

I'm sure the exhibition will arrive on tour in Nature In Art, Twigworth, Gloucester next year but in the meantime here's a couple of links to the exhibition and winners gallery. Just remember that to enter and have a chance of being awarded, you've got to be able to hold your breath at Titanic depths for three months, live in a tree with flesh eating insects for a couple of weeks or play mum to a heard of Hyenas in a lifelike costume to get that shot otherwise you won't get a look in!

The Epson International Pano Awards 2023

The Epson International Pano Awards 2023 has announced this year's winners, with Spaniard José David Riquelme Peñalver emerging as the standout photographer. Riquelme not only secured the prestigious title of Open Photographer of the Year but also dominated the Nature / Landscape category with his breathtaking, diverse entries.

Riquelme's three winning images wowed the judges with their thoughtful compositions, artistic flair and diverse subject matter. The Bridge captured the majestic beauty of Iceland from an aerial perspective while Alone in the Dark transported viewers to the desolate landscape of Deadvlei, in Namibia, where a singular silhouette of a tree stood against a starry night sky.

Winner of world's first AI art award

It's not that surprising that, after last year when Boris Eldgasen won (but rejected) the creative category at the Sony World Photo Awards, opening up a worldwide conversation about if and how AI and photography can coexist, he's now judging the the world's first AI art award. The Ballarat International Foto Biennale in Australia announced Annika Nordenskiöld as the inaugural winner of the Prompted Peculiar – International AI Prize. For the first time, artists and photographers were encouraged to use AI to generate images – and more than 100 submissions were entered, with Nordenskiöld's Twin Sisters in Love coming out on top.

Definitions of Set Subjects

Glass: Clear, broken, cut, coloured, stained, reflected, distorted, etc – this subject offers a huge range of creative ideas - be as imaginative as you dare! Ensure the main element / device / impression uses glass so the theme is obvious.

A Portrait: A portrait photograph is the capture of the likeness of a living person or creature in which the face and expression is predominant. The objective is to display the likeness, personality or the mood of the subject. The focus is the person's or creature's face, although the entire body may be included. A portrait is generally *not* a snapshot, but a composed image of a person or creature.

The Colour Wheel: Extremely colourful images are accepted in this category, using all the colours on the colour wheel, or create an image which uses complementary colours on the wheel for added impact (ie red / green, orange / blue, yellow /purple). The main impact of the image must be the use of colour to maximum effect. Search for Colour Theory on the internet for more information.

High Key / Low Key photography make use of lighting and contrast (or lack thereof) to create a specific mood. Most of the tones will be towards the **left** of the histogram for a **low key** image and towards the far **right** in a **high key** image. Again the internet has lots of useful articles and examples

Long Exposure: The image must show the effect of using a slow shutter speed and long exposure time – it must show an extended period of time, and that the image has been enhanced by the use of long exposure. Panning of moving subjects is allowed but other ICM techniques are not. Blur introduced through post processing is also not allowed.
