
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Club News

Hi everyone. Hope you are all well. Well, what a terrific night we had on Monday with John Mallows and model Jess. I knew from our emailing that John was conscientious and likely to put a huge amount of effort into the evening's session which we could all see. I don't think anyone would begrudge the slightly longer evening than normal as he unravelled the art of studio lighting ably assisted by the, very patient, Jess. The opportunity we had to try out some studio work for ourselves made the evening, which itself was made much easier by Jess's interaction in putting the more reticent of us (including me) at ease. Her rapid change at half time into a terrific vintage outfit was above and beyond expectations.

I should also add that John did the night's session for free as the fee he charged he donated to Jess which was very generous of him. I've enquired whether it might give us a dedicated studio day out of club time. I suspect there would be a few of us interested in this given the increasing confidence we gained over the evening.



Could I ask you to send your best three images of Jess to Jill Bewley so we can pass them to Jess for her portfolio. It was something she requested which we were more than happy to agree to.

By the way Jess is being interviewed at the Cheltenham literary festival in October about how she manages two quite different careers, scientist and part time model, the latter having funded her two University degrees. Opposite is a delightful image taken by John H.

For new club members he's added some narrative: Hi Martyn. I'd asked Jess for a demure smile, but it looked awkward, then I said "how about a grin?" and she lit up the viewfinder! This image is from the jpeg file, I haven't opened the raw yet, but even here every eyelash is visible, the technology is amazing.

My camera is a Canon 5D4 with the 24-105 F4L Mk2 Zoom, and settings were manual 1/125sec at f.11 and ISO 100. As usual, I use back button focus with AI Servo so once Jess was posed it was simply a matter of framing and then the shutter button.

Again, thank you for a great evening!

Next Monday - 4th Oct Mop Fair

It's the Cirencester Mop Fair so another chance to get your camera kit out for another practical night out. First and foremost we will meet at 7.00 pm (Not 7.30) outside the main door to the Cirencester Parish Church. There seems no point in meeting later at normal club F2F time, as it will only get colder. The current forecast suggests a 20% chance light rain and around 11c so be prepared. Do check the forecast though nearer the time. I won't be there but anyone wishing to address the club throng on their past experiences (and comp successes?) of the Mop fair and location of the attractions, please feel free.

John Spreadbury asked, last Monday, if we could add a note about what kit to bring and camera settings, so here's a few thoughts and some helpful links below

Street images - always difficult at night but for handheld, go for as high an ISO setting as possible without noticeable "noise" ("grain" for film buffs) and go wide on the F-stop (e.g. f2.8). That will keep the speed as fast as practical. You could use a monopod to steady yourself but **don't switch off** stabilisation. It's a practical tool in a busy place and easily transportable. Use all the available light you can get to increase the shutter speed and with wide f-stops you have a chance of creating "bokeh" from the glitter balls and fairground lights in stalls.

Fixed shots - use a tripod and **switch off stabilisation**. A tripod is probably more likely to get you better quality images and is vital for creating moving fairground ride effects but it's more cumbersome in a crowded street. Think about location given that you could be potentially exposing for seconds. Getting down low can be effective. Go for low ISO but your shutter speeds will be much slower. If you have one, use a remote camera release for taking pictures to avoid camera shake. Experiment with F-stops (F8/F11 being typical) and remember, using F16 will create a "starburst" effect on streetlights whilst F2 can create "bokeh".

Special effects - in addition to capturing moving rides, try panning at slow speed to get movement but with the subject frozen - difficult with a tripod so try both tripod and handheld. Just remember that high ISO for handheld, low ISO for tripod. Also try the "zoom burst "technique whilst the lens

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is open to create multi coloured effects. A word of caution - don't make the image too busy - it's not something comp judges like (busy pictures) so you need to think about where your eye will land in viewing the image - unless you just fancy the effect (and hate judges!)

Lenses - personal preference but will get potentially more motion blur with longer telephoto lenses (200mm) compared to wider angle (24mm) unless you are using a tripod. An all-round 24mm -105mm lens (DSLR) would work well if you are travelling light but adding a telephoto 200mm can help with those candid shots.

Batteries - lose their power in cold conditions so take spares.

Flash - will have limited value in big spaces unless you can use it off camera creatively - but for that you'll need an assistant. Better to exploit the available lighting from stalls etc.

RAW - if you can, shoot in RAW as it helps to control noise in post processing. You need all the pixels you can get!

Camera custom - if your camera has custom settings (which can be up to three) think about setting up some bespoke custom settings before you go out to save time on the night e.g. **setting 1** - for hand held - ISO 3000 +, F2.8, white balance Auto, speed Auto - (which can be adjusted during shooting). **Setting 2** - for Tripod ISO 100, f8/f11, white balance Auto, speed Auto - (which can be adjusted during shooting). It's your choice.

Here's a few articles to get you in the mood. The advice is all pretty consistent but if you also type "Photographing fairgrounds at night" into YouTube, you'll also get some interesting stuff. Go for the channels with lots of subscribers - they are likely to be more professional. Good luck.

Appendix 1: Club Face to Face (F2F) Meetings - Covid Measures

The easing of Covid restrictions over the summer as part of the Covid roadmap has made physical club meetings a practical proposition and Watermoor Parish are now permitting hire of their hall facility again. To enable this and to satisfy their insurers there are a number of things that hirers have to provide to gain approval for hire. After some consideration, below is a summary of the club's approach to enable meetings to take place within the requirements. We will aim to put the relevant docs on the website if members want to have a look.

Clearly members will need to make their own judgements in light of their individual circumstances, but it is hoped that the pragmatic approach taken allows the club to recommence face to face club (F2F) nights as per the season's programme in an enjoyable manner. As always with these things this is subject to any changes in guidance. Please get in touch with me, or other committee members, if you have any issues arising. Many thanks. Stephen

Watermoor Church Hall Hire Covid Measures

Our activities must remain consistent with government guidelines at the time of the event. The requirements from the hall involve some element of cleaning by the club before and after the evening's programme.

Emphasis will be on precautions taken and as such the club:

(i) advises that anyone feeling unwell or having been notified for quarantine under Track and trace or NHS App or as a result of travelling requirements should not attend club meetings.

(ii) will ensure that seating, social distancing and ventilation are consistent with government guidelines.

(iii) request that members bring personal crockery/cutlery for any refreshments - some disposable items will be made available. We will not utilise hall crockery, just the kettle/boiler as appropriate.

(iv) suggest members consider continuing to use facemasks during meetings when appropriate.

Club Approach

1. The club will provide hand sanitiser for members use on entrance and exit from the hall.

- 1. The hall has QR posters displayed for members who wish to utilise the NHS app.
- 2. In accordance with general "Health and Safety" good practice, a log will be kept of attendees on a F2F club night in case of the need for evacuation from premises which facilitates a roll call.
- 3. Access to kitchen facilities will be restricted to reduce contacts and users will sanitise hands before and after use of kettle etc. It is noted that no cleaning of switches is to take place

(for safety) therefore the emphasis is on sanitising hands before and after any such operations, ensuring hands are dry.

- 4. Access to W/C's is restricted to one person at a time under the hall guidelines. Members should sanitise hands on entry and exit. At the end of evening contact points are wiped down as part of the exit process.
- 5. The club will use readily available Covid appropriate cleaning materials in the form of spray /paper towel and/or sanitising wipes to facilitate cleaning and provide bags to remove used material from the hall on completion.
- 6. Hard contact points e.g. door handles/locks, window handles/locks will be wiped on first contact when being operated and on final use when closed prior to exit.
- 7. The club anticipate utilising a restricted number of members on a given night to clean and handle equipment/chairs etc. thus reducing the number of potential contacts.
- 8. Those members should sanitise hands before commencing any handling, using spray/wipes to clean contact points when moving /setting up chairs etc. On completion of set up handling, members should sanitise hands again before commencing the actual event.
- 9. It is assumed that club materials in the locked storage may also be potentially contaminated and therefore contact points should be wiped before handling and on replacing in store.

Although it all sounds a bit complicated, I hope that we will soon get into the swing of things in managing what we do to minimise impacts. Do get in contact if you have any queries. Stephen.

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Officers Reports

Report from the President

It has not been a good time for anyone during this chaotic season and the ongoing pandemic, with lockdowns and restrictions, for clubs and all WCPF events, where we have had to resort to Zoom to continue with our activities. Zoom has been a saviour for some and has brought enjoyment but has been a blight for others, who have not found it so enjoyable and have missed the social side and the face to face meetings. Many have suffered with poor internet and slow connections. It has brought with it disappointment for print workers who have not been able to share their images, they have had to either sit back or join in with the Zoom meetings and the DPI club competitions, lectures and the sharing of images.

However, the WCPF has kept going and a big thank you must go out to all the organisers and their helpers of all the WCPF events this season because without them they would not have taken place. It has also been a learning curve for many.

Kingswood Salver in November 2020, normally a panel of prints competition had to take on a different form as a DPI competition on Zoom as it will be again this year.

DPIC at the start of 2021 held via Zoom was a success.

Knightshayes Trophy, again usually a print competition but due to the pandemic was a DPI competition and again I believe this was a success. Unless things change between now and March 2022 this will revert back to its normal format of prints.

AV competition, held again via Zoom and organised by Ian Bateman, which was another very successful event and enjoyed by many.

WCPF Exhibition, although 2020 exhibition did not go ahead all the images were carried forward to this year and initially we thought we were only going to be able to hold the DPI part of the competition, but credit must go to Pedro Landers, Ralph Snook, the judges, all other members of the team and all ATS's who managed to meet up to allow the judging of the images. We could not have a full blown exhibition but the results were issued and available for all to see.

Sadly we could not hold the inter club print competition because of the difficulties that it would bring, it was just not viable with the situation at that time. However we are planning to hold the event in 2022.

We hosted a successful Awards for Photographic Merit advisory day, organised by the PAGB where a number of WCPF club members sent in images to have potential images reviewed. We are also hosting an adjudication day in November.

Once again a big thank you goes to all the organisers of these events who have worked tirelessly to bring all these events to you. They give their time freely and often working alone to make these things happen. So I would like to thank all the committee, Sue, Chris, Bill, Eddy, Pam, Ralph, Pedro, Russell, Stephen, Helen, Peter, Ian, Ann, Sandie, Alex and Dennis for all they have done this season. If there is anyone out there who would like to join the committee and would like to help out, to see what it is all about and who feel they may have something to offer please speak to one of the committee members or send Sue an email to register your interest. It is new blood that keeps an active organisation going.

Report from the Treasurer

Attached year end summary. Peter Weaver and Pip Rabbits audited these on 4 September 2021.

I have little to add to the notes in the 'remarks' column. The only major expense is perhaps the cost of setting up the new website. We paid for a 3 year subscription to save money. The federation has incurred Zoom fees and paid speakers nominal amounts, usually to a nominated charity of theirs.

Club subscriptions for 2021-22 will fall due in the normal way, with invoices going out towards the end of November beginning December. I have yet to find out if the PAGB will be levying subs.

Some Clubs are clearly struggling to make ends meet with reduced membership, not least in being able to afford a meeting room charge. Consequently WCPF subs will remain the same as before the one off special £5.00 sub for the last year. This means that the basic WCPF sub will be £27.50 for up to 25 members and £1.10 per additional member. Public Liability Insurance will still be payable separately via Darwin Clayton or your own choice of insurer. If any club is in financial difficulty and wishes to discuss options please discuss with me (the Treasurer).

The WCPF has already incurred some costs for the current year, such as a deposit for the Corn Exchange - Exeter for DPIC. If DPIC does not go ahead then this deposit will be forfeited.
