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Club News

Hi everyone. Hope you are all well. We had an excellent day on Wednesday this week with Leigh Preston taking us through his world of photography accompanied by tips and tricks to help us improve our photography. The day was interspersed with a few coffee breaks, lunch and a session for those who brought along images for him to critique (not judge!) which brought added value to the day. Although 10.00am - 4.00pm seems long for a non 'hands on' type of presentation, Leigh's light touch and humour along with questions and answers during the talk seemed to make the time fly. I sensed that everyone got a lot out of the day and I'm sure we will do it again. Leigh has other presentations on specific photographic subjects and can take outdoor workshops too. As a Gloucester resident and highly qualified RPS member, we are lucky to have him on our doorstep. Leigh emailed me after the talk with a thought-provoking note:

- Photography is a means of Expression, that's what 'seeing' pictures is all about. The final outcome, aim if you like, is to take pictures that make great prints for you wall. It's an opportunity to immerse yourself in something satisfying and creative.
- Learn your camera, your lighting and how to adjust your pictures in whatever software package you use. Learning to print is the next stage.
- SO SEEING IMAGES
- Look beyond the 'souvenir' post-card, look past the obvious, seeing properly means 'involvement' and discovery.
- Make the most of chances that occur, or make the most of your ideas, to take & make enjoyable pictures, BUT make sure they are honest and have a sense of integrity.
- Put 'expression' above or before technical perfection/ technique. It is needed to some extent, but as long as it does not dictate and make your work staged and sterile.
- Avoid 'so called rules' by looking at visually effective design, by using picture space intuitively. This is 'visual' awareness, don't accept second best from yourself, either.
- Observe with a sense of truth and accuracy, remember what's important to you is usually
 your own personal response to what you witness, what you find and see in your own way,
 but don't 'force' a picture by expecting absolute perfection, just look at the world with a
 sense of wonder like you once did as a wide-eyed child.
- Make pictures that show an emphasis, but which are selective, simplified in such a way that what's not required isn't there omit what you don't want in your image
- Think about geometry and perspective. Avoid visual monotony.
- Use humour, emotion, melancholy, joy etc to 'flavour' your pictures so that they mean something, and that they make the viewer feel something. Pictures should have a 'voice'.
- Think 'sideways' at times overexpose for lighter pictures, make them darker to give them 'clout' and drama, use minimal depth of field, movement and take chances by using slow shutter speeds and nothing in focus.
- Finally DON'T PHOTOGRAPH WHAT SOMETHING IS, PHOTOGRAPH WHAT IT COULD BE.
