



Tools of the trade

One of the benefits of competitions like the Print Panel Challenge is that it gets you thinking as to what your subject is going to be and how it's to be created and presented. I gave a talk last year on Focus Bracketing (or Focus Stacking) and used what I had learnt for the talk in creating my Print Panel Challenge entry last Monday. For the photos used in my Focus Bracketing talk, I made a mini still life studio and bought some backdrop stuff on the internet to help. When I was putting together my Panel, it struck me that you might find it helpful to know where you can get creative photo stuff so here's a few links:

- 1. Mirror finished stainless steel (better than a glass mirror as you don't get the double reflection from both the glass and mirror surface) http://www.metaloffcuts.co.uk/
- 2. Perspex sheet I use cast acrylic sheet http://wholesalepos.com
- 3. Correction and creative gel filters for led light panels Decareta Store on Amazon.
- 4. Vinyl backdrops for placing still life on. Numerous options https://clubbackdrops.com/
- 5. Mini lightbox studios. I made my own fold away MDF open sided version so I could add side lighting but there's loads on Amazon. The only disadvantage with many 'ready to go' mini studios is that they are enclosed, some with built in lighting which reduces scope to do you own lighting effects.
- 6. Mini T-shaped backdrop holding stand Selens's Store on Amazon. Use with a fold away picnic table as the base as an alternative to a home made mini lightbox.
- 7. Led light panel (rechargeable, dimmable, variable Kelvin) see VILTROX store on Amazon.
- 8. Light stands Amazon Basics Aluminum 2.04 m Light Stand with Case, Black. Sold in pairs.
- 9. Mini ball head for light panel the Neewer store on Amazon but see https://www.amazon.co.uk/Removable-Detachable-Installation-Compatible-SmallRig/dp/B0BFWSZCX3?ref = ast sto dp&th=1&psc=1

Definitions of Set Subjects

Glass: Clear, broken, cut, coloured, stained, reflected, distorted, etc – this subject offers a huge range of creative ideas - be as imaginative as you dare! Ensure the main element / device / impression uses glass so the theme is obvious.

A Portrait: A portrait photograph is the capture of the likeness of a living person or creature in which the face and expression is predominant. The objective is to display the likeness, personality or the mood of the subject. The focus is the person's or creature's face, although the entire body may be included. A portrait is generally *not* a snapshot, but a composed image of a person or creature.

The Colour Wheel: Extremely colourful images are accepted in this category, using all the colours on the colour wheel, or create an image which uses complementary colours on the wheel for added impact (ie red / green, orange / blue, yellow /purple). The main impact of the image must be the use of colour to maximum effect. Search for Colour Theory on the internet for more information.

High Key / Low Key photography make use of lighting and contrast (or lack thereof) to create a specific mood. Most of the tones will be towards the **left** of the histogram for a **low key** image and towards the far **right** in a **high key** image. Again the internet has lots of useful articles and examples

Long Exposure: The image must show the effect of using a slow shutter speed and long exposure time – it must show an extended period of time, and that the image has been enhanced by the use of long exposure. Panning of moving subjects is allowed but other ICM techniques are not. Blur introduced through post processing is also not allowed.
