Club Summer Outing


Next Monday 24th June - **5.00 pm** at Glos University campus, The Park, Cheltenham - Squirrel Safari

Here's some key info:

- 1. The meet up time is **5.00pm** Expected to end 6.00/ 6.30pm. More info below.
- 2. The place is Glos Uni campus, The Park, Cheltenham.
- 3. Parking is in the overflow area accessed via Entrance Gate 4, <u>NOT ENTRANCE GATE 3</u> which is where the official car park is (which will be closed). See map below.
- 4. On entering the Campus, drive around Fullwood Lodge (No 16 on the Plan) and into a gravel overflow parking area by some lorry containers.
- 5. Campus Security are aware. However, the head of Security has just informed me that there is an evening parking charge of £1. Also, a container is due for delivery on Monday, so he is not sure how much space that will take up. If we get a problem, there is on street parking in nearby Tivoli Road. So, parking might be a bit fluid.
- 6. You might find it handy to car share.

- 7. You should see many squirrels, ducks and chicks, including a breeding pair of Mandarins, geese and their (rapidly growing) chicks.
- 8. You might be lucky enough to feed some squirrels by hand. I've done it.
- 9. There's a lake which you can walk around, (it used to be part of a botanical garden in the 1800's). It's never that busy as the public think the campus is private!
- 10. Bring a long lens, suggest up to 200mm, something to kneel on (to avoid the bird poo), some nuts for the squirrels and food for the duck and geese.
- 11. We will meet in The Tivoli pub afterwards which is just up the road. There's normally parking in front of an adjacent row of shops and in the roads around. It's shown by the red dropped pin at the top of the Google earth map below. You can see The Park Campus at the bottom of the map.

By way of background, there's a couple of reasons why we've gone for the earlier meet up time. First, I've tended to find that squirrels are still running around at this earlier time whereas later on there are fewer of them about. They are tame because dogs aren't allowed in the park and many locals feed them. Secondly, the A417 from the Air Balloon to Cirencester overnight closure starts at 9.00pm although you can get back to Cirencester via the A435 'valley road'. If it's a good day the lighting around the lake can be striking, albeit quite contrasting. If it's wet, then maybe a meet up back in Cirencester - keep an eye on the WhatsApp group.



Definitions of Set Subjects

JOURNEY: A journey photograph is an image captured during the course of a journey or expedition, typically depicting scenes, landscapes, people, or moments encountered along the way. These photographs often aim to convey the essence of the journey, capturing the spirit of exploration, discovery, and adventure.

UK Flora, Fauna, Fungi: A flora, fauna, fungi photograph is an image that showcases plant life (flora), animal life (fauna), or fungi found in a particular ecosystem or habitat. These photographs aim to highlight the diversity, beauty, and intricacies of the natural world. They can range from close-up shots of individual species to wide-angle landscapes that capture entire ecosystems.

Golden/Blue Hour: During the golden hour, the sun is low in the sky, casting long shadows and creating a warm, diffused light that can enhance the colours and textures in a scene, often producing a soft, flattering glow. In contrast, the blue hour occurs just before sunrise or after sunset when the sky takes on a deep blue hue, creating a serene and tranquil atmosphere.

Still Life: A still life photograph is an image that portrays inanimate objects, typically arranged by the photographer to create a visually compelling composition. It can range from simple, minimalist compositions to more elaborate and stylized scenes, depending on the creative vision of the photographer.

Closed: A photograph with the title "closed" could depict a variety of subjects or scenes, but the title suggests a theme of closure, restriction, or inaccessibility.

Summer Cup (judged by members)

This is an informal competition which takes place during the 'off season' between June and September. Members can submit an image on one or all of the following subjects, which must be taken between May 20th 2024 and Sept 2nd 2024. These will then be judged by the other members at the start of the season. Images must be sent via the Club Dropbox before Monday 02 September 2024.

- 1. Small
- 2. Medium
- 3. Large
