Programme Secretary' Review

So, we're off! We had a decent turnout of over 30 members for our opening meeting, including over 20 who had already paid their subscriptions. An excellent start. Those who haven't paid yet know what to do!

The committee went through their roles and responsibilities again, together with a brief outline of their photographic histories. Some images were shown, though no puffins at this stage. I feel we may see some later in the season. I then gave a quick rundown of this year's programme. Thanks to those members who came to speak to me afterwards with offers of contributions for the member nights, and for thoughts on the Plan B ideas.

After the break (and many thanks to Bex for stepping up into the barista role) David gave us an interesting insight into the current uses (or should that be misuses) of AI in photography, including the way it is employed to clean up images in Lightroom. The use of ChatGPT to modify images, and critique them suggesting Photoshop improvements was very illuminating. I'm sure there will be more discussion to come, especially with regard to competition images. Finally, David gave us a brief introduction to his Members Challenge Part 2. This year it will focus on improving our understanding and use of camera settings. It will be a 30 week challenge, with task 1 being an aperture and depth of field assignment. More details will follow in Vignettes.

Next week we have our regular evening looking at the WCPF Travelling Print Exhibition. There are 72 prints, covering three sections - Nature, Open Mono and Open Colour - about a third of the images which were shown at the WCPF 2025 Members Exhibition in May. The good news is that none of the prints have been lost by Evri this year, so they will be the highest quality selection.

If you thought that the opening meeting was like the first day back at school next week will be like a fun exam time. We will split into 6 tables and review the prints in batches. The invigilator (i.e. me) will allow 10-15 minutes review and discussion time, and will then ask for views on the 'best' print from each batch. At the end of the evening I will tot up the scores and we will have another look at the most popular prints and see if our choices agree with those of the WCPF judges.

The event will be projected at our meeting hall if any of your members would like to attend in person but also available on Zoom (Zoom details issued nearer the time). Steve will be in the hall.

General Rules

Deadline for submission	Please email or transfer your images to me by the end of Friday 19th September 2025 so that I can get all images packaged up and to the judge two weeks prior to the Battle.
Number of Images	Each club to submit 20 images with no more than 3 images from the same author
Image Author and AI	All images submitted must have been taken by the club member using a photographic process. Composite images are permitted provided all component images meet this requirement. This means any software that adds content that is not the photographer's content is not permitted. This includes but is not restricted to the use of clip-art or another photographer's image, downloaded textures or backgrounds, third-party decorative borders, AI generated content that draws content from outside the photographer's own work, replacing clouds with stock images (using your own cloud images is fine), plus shaped or textured brushes not created by the photographer.

	Technology that enhances an existing image without drawing on image data from outside that image (e.g., AI De-noise, AI Scaling, AI Sharpening) is acceptable. Software tools that replace or remove an image element or extend an image such as content-aware fill, healing, patching or object removal are only permitted where the source for the inserted image data is wholly contained within the base image(s).
Image Currency	No image can be more than 3 years old at the time of submission
Digital Images	The native size for our projector used in the hall is 1920 pixels wide * 1200 pixels high. Smaller images will still project but will appear smaller than the full size image and larger images will be reduced to fit. Colour Space/Mode: SRGB, 8 bit File Format: .jpg only
File Naming	Short Title followed by underscore_ then Authors name E.g. The Beginning_Dave Young.jpg The only characters to be used in file names are letters A-Z and numbers 0-9 and underscore.

Running of the Battle

The images will be anonymised to include title only and the projection order randomised before delivering to the judge in advance of the Battle.

Zoom details will be issued in advance of the Battle.

We will have 30 images and then a short break before the remaining 30 images.

Score sheets will be emailed in advance of the meeting. The score sheets are automated, requiring only the score and "return" to be typed and it gives half time as well as final scores and also the final positioning so our results should all tally!

After the welcomes and introductions, Steve will give us his comments and score (out of 20) and I will then announce the club and then move onto the next image.

Definitions of Set Subjects

SQUARE FORMAT: typically refers to using a square aspect ratio (1:1) intentionally as a creative constraint or theme. This can be achieved in camera, or by cropping during post processing. So, you are being asked to explore how composition, balance, or storytelling changes when restricted to a square. The square naturally invites symmetry, central framing, and geometric precision and works well for portraits, minimalism, or patterns. Rule of thirds still <u>applies but feels different, centred subjects often look stronger in square, and negative space becomes more powerful. Explore how the square changes emotional or narrative impact. How does it shift the viewer's attention compared to landscape or portrait orientation?</u>

AUTOMOTIVE: A follow- on from Amy Shore's Presentation in October. A chance to explore and creatively interpret vehicles and the world around them as your primary theme. This can go far beyond simply photographing a car — it's an invitation to tell stories, explore design, motion, culture, and even emotion through the lens of automotive imagery.

IN THE KITCHEN: Typically, a scene encompassing components or activities that you would find in the kitchen. This could be food still life, equipment and utensils or an activity such as stirring a pot.

Club Competitions from September 2025

Club Competitions are designed to allow members the opportunity for their best images to be critiqued by a qualified judge from outside the club whilst engaged in friendly competition with other club members. The judge will award the following positions and points.

1st Place6 points2nd Place5 points3rd Place4 pointsHighly Commended3 pointsCommended2 pointsAll other entries1 point

Points from all externally judged competitions throughout the season are totalled prior to the Awards Evening and the member with the most points is awarded the **Presidents Cup**.

Summer Cup

The Summer Cup is a Member Judged competition held at the start of each season. Members may enter one DPI taken at one of the Club's Summer Events that year. As this competition is member judged all entries, including those placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd may be entered in any General or Annual Competition.

General Competitions

All General Competitions are externally judged and consist of 2 sections:

- 1. Digital Projected Image (DPI)
- 2. Mounted Print

There are 6 competitions throughout the season -3×0 pen and 3×0 Set Subject. Following completion of all six competitions trophies are awarded at the Annual AGM to the members with the most points in each of the following Categories.

- 1. Open DPI
- 2. Open Print
- 3. Set DPI
- 4. SET Print

Set subjects, submission and judging dates are available on the Club Website, Vignettes and Pixoroo.

Annual Competitions

There are several Trophy based Annual Competitions, many dedicated to the memory of past Camera Club members. Judging is spread over two evenings towards the end of the season. Members may enter once in each competition with the winner holding the Trophy for one year.

Competition Rules from 1st September 2025

General Competitions

- 1. There are 6 General competitions (3 Open and 3 set subject) per Season each consisting of 2 categories Digital Projected Image (DPI) and Print.
- 2. Club members may enter one entry in each category for each General Competition.
- 3. All digital images must be in the sRGB colour space, no greater than 1600 pixels wide ×1200 pixels high, and 2.3Gb in size.
- 4. All prints must be mounted with mount size not to exceed 50cmx40cm and a digital image of each Print entry must be provided.
- 5. All image Manipulation processes and techniques are eligible, provided that:
 - a) the image originates from a camera or smartphone.
 - b) entrants own the copyright to every element of their submissions the image, including its components.
 - c) Al techniques (eg Al denoise, Al sharpening) can be used to enhance the image provided that data is not drawn from outside the existing image to create new content (Generative Al).
 - d) the image is no older than three (3) years from the first meeting of the current club season.
 - e) any modification of the original image must be made by the author or under his/her personal direction.
- 6. All General Competition entries both DPI and Print should be uploaded to Pixoroo by the Competition close date.
- 7. All Prints should be handed to the Competitions Secretary by the competition close date specified in Pixoroo and the Club programme.
- 8. All digital images and digital images of prints entered for any competition must be available for use in inter-club competitions and for display on the club website. All prints must be available for interclub battles and for publicity displays in
- 9. Cirencester.
- 10. The club reserves the right to maintain a catalogue of all images entered in competitions.
- 11. A digitally projected image or print that has been awarded a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in any class of General competition may not be entered into any Club, Summer or Annual competition again.
- 12. Entries cannot be submitted more than twice in any class.

Annual Competitions

- 1. Annual Competitions are divided into a range of categories. Details of each category are published on the Club Website, Vignettes and Pixoroo. Winners of each category are awarded a trophy.
 - a) The General Competition rules plus the additional rules below apply to all Annual Competitions.
 - b) Members can enter one image per category.
 - c) Members must have entered 2 or more General Competitions during the current season.

- d) Entries for competitions that feature practical night/club outing must be taken between the previous judging date and the closing date of the current seasons Annual Competitions.
- e) A digitally projected image or print that has been awarded a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in any class of Annual competition may not be entered into any General, Summer or Annual competition again.
- f) A monochrome image is an image that consists of varying tones of a single colour. Most commonly, this refers to grayscale images, which contain only shades of grey ranging from black to white. However, a monochrome image can also use any other single hue, with variations in brightness or intensity.
- g) Sporting Action is defined as fast paced competitive activity governed by a specific set of rules defined by a sports governing body.
